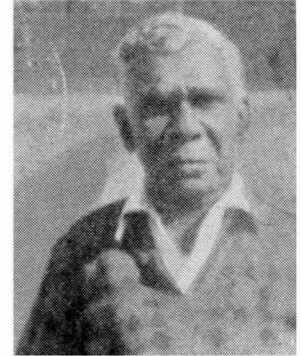
The people featured here are justly proud of the fact that the Board has seen fit to honour them with Exemption Certificates.
